# NOMINATIONS FOR NZARE COUNCIL

- Nominations are invited for open council positions. These include all positions where members have served their two year term and are therefore up for renewal.
- Both co-presidents have completed their terms. Our Māori co-president, Mere Berryman has had 3 years in the role and has expressed a desire to step down. This is a critical role co-leading the whole of NZARE as an association. While the co-president Māori is likely to have important links to the Māori caucus, nominees for co-president should also have the mana, expertise, time, and willingness to contribute to overseeing and advancing the association at large. Co-presidents (whether Māori or non-Māori) are likely to be senior scholars with prior experience in leadership and/or governance roles.
- Our other co-president, Robyn Caygill has had 2 years in the role. She would be happy to stay on for another term if the members agree. Prior to COVID, we had a system where one co-president was in the first year of their term while the other was in their second year. This enabled strong continuity of leadership in the organisation. With Mere standing down and Robyn ending her term, council would like to propose to members that there is a good argument for Robyn to continue in this role, using the strengths and connections she has built in the last year. However, this position will still be open for nominations.
- Our treasurer, Rachel Cann, has had 2 years in the role and would be happy to stay on for another term if the members agree. There is also a good argument for continuity in the role as it is a complex role that requires an analytical mind.
- There are 3 other positions available, Secretary of the organisation and two general roles. Those members appointed to all 3 roles will be expected to take an active role in growing and strengthening the organisation.

To enable members to fairly judge when it comes time to vote at the AGM, please provide a paragraph on the nominee's skills and strengths applicable to the council position.
