The past year has seen an extension and strength of the capability of Māori caucus through the first ever published Monograph by Maori Caucus which was in Te Reo Māori. The support from Te Wahanga was instrumental in achieving a successful result.

## **Further mahi for 2014**

An annual Journal in te reo Māori is in development. The first of the series will feature narratives by Wāhine Māori covering Kaupapa Māori, Mātauranga Māori, Te Reo me ōna Tikanga, with the majority of contributors being academics and native speakers who are writers of the reo and have gained their Masters in Te Reo Māori.

As there will be a joint conference being held in Brisbane next year, a two day symposium including the Māori caucus hui is being organised for mid 2014 in Aotearoa (possibly in Mataatua).

The symposium will include a selection of writers from the 2012 Monograph *Kawea te Wairua o te Kupu* that will be presented in te Reo Māori. The symposium will be inclusive to of all Maori academics, including tangata whenua from the rohe, we will be asking kura within the rohe to send kaiako and tamariki to listen to presentations.
