Associate Professor Jayne White, Ph.D, is a researcher and educator with over 20 years' experience in early childhood. Her contribution to New Zealand early childhood research together with her international theoretical and methodological contributions, both within and beyond the early childhood discipline is exemplary. Jayne's work is at the cutting edge of theorising the ethics of infant and toddler pedagogy and developing approaches to professional practice that genuinely listen and respond to young children's perspectives.

Jayne's work is of the highest quality and pushes methodological boundaries. She is recognised for fostering inclusiveness and her ability to build research communities, including her support for mentoring new researchers. Jayne's personal research trajectory shows prolific dissemination nationally and internationally and has had major impacts on a number of scholarly fields with a particular focus on infant and toddler pedagogy and educational philosophy.

Jayne has taken national and international leadership roles to advance the study of infants and toddlers using visual pedagogies. Her research influence and impact continue to grow as she fosters the capacity of others in new research methodologies.
